NEW MUSEUM IN BERLIN: THE COLD WAR MUSEUM BERLIN TO OPEN IN AUTUMN 2022 AT THE HISTORICALLY SIGNIFICANT LOCATION UNTER DEN LINDEN

'TWO SIDES OF THE SAME STORY' IS THE SLOGAN OF THE HIGH-TECH MUSEUM 4.0

ITS CREATORS OPEN 4TH MUSEUM IN BERLIN

New Museum in Berlin: In autumn 2022, the **Cold War Museum Berlin** is set to open. The new high-tech museum is located at Unter den Linden 14 - in the heart of the former capital of the Cold War.

'Two sides of the same story' - The historic-scientific perspective of this era is at the heart of the **Cold War Museum Berlin**. As the first Museum in Germany, the museum allows to experience the cold war in its international complexity.

Located between Brandenburger Tor and the Humboldt Forum, amid the renowned boulevard directly at the new train station 'Unter den Linden', the museum presents on two floors, exceeding 1,600 square metres, the multitude of facets of the Cold War: from the formation of the bloc right after World War II to the nuclear threat, the Cuban Missile Crisis, international espionage, the arms race and proxy wars up to the peaceful competition of the systems in sport, economics, science and research – an example being space race and the Olympic games. The arc spans from 1945 to the dissolution of the UdSSR in 1991.

Visitors relive the history of the Cold War with modern technology per the Zeitgeist in an innovative and exciting experience as an entirely new and future-oriented concept.

The creators of the museum are the museum expert Carsten Kollmeier and his partner Dr Harald Braun, who were responsible for the realisation of the **Dalí Museum Berlin**, the **Spy Museum Berlin** (now: Deutsches Spionagemuseum/ German Spy Museum) and the most recent **Samurai Museum**.

Carsten Kollmeier describes his vision: "The COLD WAR MUSEUM Berlin was missing in Berlin. The visitor can experience a historical era with its great importance here. Finally, it receives the place and attention which the decades of the Cold War have held and still hold. We wish to engage and excite young and old cross-generationally and intergenerationally for a long time toward history in a high-tech museum 4.0.
